The Inauguration was solemnized by the cutting of the ribbon by Sr Rose Celine, the Superior General, unveiling the plaque by Sr Joy, the Provincial Superior and blessing by Most Rev Dominic Jala, the Archbishop of Shillong. Some of the decisions made were- Provide hostel facilities for working women and migrant youth wherever possible, Region wise hostel students exchange program, all community members to be involved in hostel ministry and Career guidance to students including religious life.

Home Mission in the Province

Home mission was initiated in 2 Centres of the Province, viz. Kathalcherra and Viswema during 6 to 12 January 2017. The sisters who participated in this mission

In the state of Tripura, it was in Kathalcherra under the Good Shepherd Parish in the diocese of Agartala. This parish

has 28 sub centers in the far out villages. Here the Home mission was launched under the leadership of



Sr Sandhya, and with a good support from Fr Lancy D'Souza csc the Parish priest and Sr Suman the Superior of Bethany Convent



Kathalcherra. 25 sisters who knew Bengali or Darlong language were chosen.

The Sisters were warmly welcomed in the parish. 7 villages were chosen and sisters stayed in these villages in groups of 3 to 4. They visited the Catholic families, listened to them, shared the Word of God and prayed with them. In the evenings people gathered after their daily work for common Rosary and sisters gave instructions on Sacraments.

It was a thrilling experience for sisters to walk long distances, experience hardships in locating the houses, and visit every family in their area, know their struggles and be enriched by their life of faith. They visited about 240 families.

In Nagaland, Home mission was arranged at St Joseph

Convent, Viswema where we have Catholic families in the same village belonging to



Angami Tribe. Sr Harsha the Superior of the Convent arranged the needful in consultation with Fr Jerome Veigas SJ the Parish Priest, Village Leaders and Catechists. Sr Mary Laldikzuali along with 17 sisters and 3 candidates participated in this mission. So 21 of them in different groups along with a few BLA members shared the 'Joy of the Gospel' with the Catholic community. They learnt to appreciate the faith of the people, their culture, life style and their way of dealing with problems. A total 113 families were visited.
