In favour of the Poor

Sr Nalini, Samalkha, Haryana

An unimaginably large number of 633 migrant children are beneficiaries of Bethany Social Service at Samalkha. Our focus group in social work consists of the migrants who are construction workers, rickshaw pullers and factory workers. In the year 2018 a project was sanctioned by Arise Foundation for the prevention of human trafficking. Through this programme, the children are drawn to positive behaviour through education in the eight remedial centres close to the brick-kilns. The adoloscents who work in various factories attend classes twice a week. Eight groups of migrant women receive skill training and participate in adult



education. The rickshaw pullers and construction workers receive their legal aid and updates on Govt. schemes time to time. The children participate enthusiastically in the 'Children's Parliament' gaining insights into their rights and privileges. Guided by twenty animators covering twenty two villages, eight centres of remedial classes, eight children's parliament, ten adolescent girls, six adolescent boys groups, ninety five kitchen garden, eight senior citizen's groups, shine bright motivating others to make their lives better. Along with Pragati Social Servive Society of IMS Fathers, Bethany enlightens forty seven self help groups. Home remedies, herbal medicines, and massage oils prepared by Sr Lancia are a much sought after source of healing. The undying enthusiasm of Sudesh Rani, the long standing animator, is a strong prop to Sr Nalini, the director of social work at Samalkha.

Bethany aims at contributing its share in creating improved literacy, peace, harmony, justice and a pollution free environment.

Commenting on Christmas Event he said that it is situated in the barest ingredients of life - a newborn baby, a woman in pain, a man in bewilderment, an inn shut tight against human need, a cattle-shed, shepherds, a star in the sky, three wise men and singing angels.

At the heart of Christmas is a universal insight. What human beings need is not religion, but God. Religion gets overrun by rituals, traditions and customs. It becomes progressively blind to the human predicament. God's core concern is for the individual.

Jesus is God revealed as person-specific love. As the Bible says, "God knows you by your name." Not only that. "He has seen you from your mother's womb." He invites you to abide in him and he wishes to abide in you. Christmas inaugurates a reassuring state of intimacy between God and human beings.

Jesus represents the counter-paradigm predicated on the greatness of serving, rather than in being served. The chasm that no political philosophy or model of government known hitherto has been able to bridge lies between serving and being served. The political good news in the Christmas Event is that good governance is indeed possible. But, for that to become real, rulers have to be servants and have to be ruled by God, the God of love. In Christmas, God as love takes on the form of a servant and rejected power.

The proof that God is in our midst is not that there are imposing temples and churches, but that strangers are transformed into neighbours; and neighbours into sisters and brothers. Christmas is, therefore, a festival of the neighbour - a sort of godly Diwali or festival of lights in which we light up life as neighbors to each other.

I wish a very meaningful Christmas to all of you. May the year 2020 be filled with Peace, Contentment and Love.

A REASON TO REJOICE

St Joseph's Convent Punjabi Medium School at Bathinda, buzzed with the festivity of Golden Jubilee and the curtains came down on the year long celebrations on 23 November 2019. It was indeed a showcase of what one can do with the poor, because the school offers admission to the underprivileged.

The celebrations began at 10:00 am on 23 November, with a thanksgiving Eucharistic celebration offered by Rev.Dr.Angelo Rufino Gracious, Administrator of Jalandhar Diocese, along with 12 other priests. The prayers articulated God's fidelity and blessings of past 50 years.

In the evening at 4:00 pm, a well rehearsed flawless cultural programme presented, stole the heart of every one. Sr Rose Celine BS, the President of Bethany Educational



Society(BES), Sr Erasma BS, the Corporate manager and Dr Amrit Sethi were the Chief Guest and Guests of Honour respectively. Safar-e-Khwab, the main item, showcased the journey of beloved Father Founder's dream of educating the poor and the marginalized, especially the girls. As a tribute to the humble beginnings, the testing times and glorious achievements, five hundred students enacted the beginning and growth of Bethany Congregation, and the birth of the Punjabi Medium School. Watching the show every one heaved a sigh of gratitude and appreciation.

In her speech, Sr Rose Celine, the Chief Guest, recalled the marvelous ways in which the school has fulfilled its mission in imparting education, discipline, moral and spiritual values in the last 50 years. She honoured the former Principals and pioneer teachers and acknowledged the service of Mrs Harjit, the first teacher. The programme concluded with a grand finale signifying the need to foster the culture of peace and love. Many dignitaries, guests,

sisters, fathers, parents special invitees, former students and benefactors, who had in their own way contributed to make St. Joseph's Punjabi Medium School rise and shine, decorated the galaxy of audience.

Remembering the Past

It was in the cold winter of January 1961 that the Bethany Sisters came to Punjab where St Joseph's School, Bathinda, was started on 12 January. Admissions poured in from all over Bathinda in quick succession, and the surrounding villages profited by the hostel that accommodated almost 300 students. The school shot to fame within a couple of years. But Mother Gemma, the Principal, was far from being happy as she observed the economically backward children grazing animals with no opportunity for good education. We must admit that unlike today, in 1961 Bathinda was considered backward in education. In 1969 moved with compassion and love, Mother Gemma started a Punjabi Medium School with 15 students on the verandha of the English Medium school. Her restless spirit saw that soon a building was constructed for the Punjabi School and the school was upgraded to Std X along with hostel facilities. Several Sisters- Sr Agnes Sequeira, Sr Gleva, Sr Melvis, Sr Leena D' Mello, Sr Tara, Sr Savina Nanda, and Sr Natal Patel shepherded the institution with full devotion as Principals. The onus of celebrating the Golden Jubilee was bestowed on Sr Jeevanlatha, the present Principal, with a great support from Sr Veena D' Souza, the Principal of English Medium School, and the staff.

The alumnae of the school spread all over and placed high is a proof that given the opportunity any one can shine and that



with good education the destiny can be changed. This was exactly what Fr RFC Mascarenhas, the Founder of Bethany Congregation, wanted his sisters to do. We can transform India only by transforming the villages and the prosperous Punjab is a witness to this. Bethany Congregation has contributed a drop in this transformation and this drop indeed is a significant one.

DECENNIAL CELEBRATIONS OF TALITHA KUM

"Together against human trafficking, weaving a web in Love," was the theme of the first Assembly to mark the 10th anniversary of Talitha Kum International, held in Rome.

From 21 to 27 September 2019, eighty six women religious representatives of different networks of five continents and forty eight countries and regions, along with a few men religious, gathered in Rome for the decennial celebrations of Talitha Kum International. This first Assembly of Talitha Kum under the aegis of Union of Superiors General (UISG,) was a time of praying, singing, reflecting, socializing and sharing dreams in order to strengthen the ministry for another decade. It was a time to recognize the work they have already accomplished and celebrate the lives of the survivors of trafficking, whom they had helped and supported. Moreover, this meet offered opportunities to be acquainted with the best practices of others through group work and exposition of their work in their countries.

Together they met the Pope, who commended their work and met them individually urging them to continue their commitment. According to Pope Francis, Talitha Kum, by uniting congregations in the shared ministry, is an example for the whole church.

Talitha Kum in 10 years has coordinated fifty two religious networks in ninety countries with 2000 workers, more than 15,000 survivors, reaching out to 2,00,000 people, preventing trafficking and creating awareness.

Sr Arpan BS, President of AMRAT, Sr Meera RGS, Executive Member and Sr Jyoti BS, Founder-President, participated in the meeting as the representatives of AMRAT Talitha Kum, India.

It is a matter of pride that Sr Jyoti Pinto BS was one of the 10 Sisters—who received recognition for pioneering the work of Talitha Kum in South Asian countries (Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka) in 2009 when she was the Superior General, Vice president of CRWI and Executive member of UISG Council.



In persuit of this endeavour, the birth of AMRAT took place in November 2009 in the first workshop held from 18-25 Novemebr 2009 at Raia, Goa, under the leadership of Sr Jyoti. She became the Foundress of AMRAT - Talitha Kum, South Asia. The Network was named AMRAT in the second workshop held in May 2010 at Dhyana Vana, Kolkatta, West Bengal. Began with forty four Sisters from twenty Congregations in 2009, AMRAT has reached out to seven hundred sisters of seventy congregations and inspired them to join in the struggle of the vulnerable people of our society.

It is worth mentioning that Pope Francis names human trafficking as a 'crime against humanity,' because it denies the human dignity of the victim, seeing him or her only as a piece of merchandise to be used to enrich or give pleasure to another.

Human trafficking, "in its multiple forms, is a wound in the humanity of those who endure it and those who commit it," said the Pope, on 11 April, 2019, addressing the closing session of a Vatican Conference.

I feel humbled to be the Indian President of AMRAT and to be actively involved in this ministry and inspire my fellow sisters to rescue and assist the victims of trafficking.



EFFORTS AFOOT TO BOOST ACCOUNTANCY SKILLS

A seminar on Financial Management and Legal Affairs organized by Sr Gracy D' Souza, the Provincial Procurator of Northern Province, at Ish Kripa, Karnal, from 30 September to 3rd October was indeed a time of learning and reviewing the past learning on the administration of temporal goods.

The resource person Rev. Fr Alex Gnanapragasam SJ, Sr Christine, the Procurator General, and Sr Gracy, guided the Sisters to get acquainted with the changing account pattern and updating the accounts accordingly. A doyen in accounts, Fr Alex G. SJ, enlightened the Sisters on legal affairs especially on Trust and Society registered under 12A, 12AA, its benefits and conditions. He also dealt with GST, FCRA, TDS, and related topics to the Society/Trust like corpus fund, donations, 80G, budgets, new laws on Income tax applicable to Society and Trust, cash transaction flow, and changes in FCRA regulations.



The area of accounting poses many challenges and we have to be ready to face the new challenges keeping in mind the vision and goal of our Congregation. The seminar was a clarion call for us to be the good stewards of the temporal goods entrusted to our care.

EDUCATION IS A MISSION

Today Education is politicized, industrialized and commercialized. The shadows of our governing system affect our schools but we need to hold on to a value based and skill based education. This point was the theme picked up for an Educator's Meet held from 9-11 August 2019 at Ish Kripa, Karnal. Our schools need to attend to the seven levels of consciousness in order to reach our goal-Transformative Education for Fullness of Life for All. This transformation is to evolve from the lowest levels of consciousness starting from Survival and moving to Relationship, Self Esteem, Transformation, Internal Cohesion, Making a difference and Service. The 40 participants discussed ways and means of Character Building and Nation Building as a part of our education. Organized by Sr Helima, the co-coordinator of Education and animated by Fr. Stanly SVD from Bombay this seminar had much to offer to the participants.

In a second workshop conducted by Fr Paul Pudussery, on 30 November 2019, the New Educational policy and its implications were highlighted. Education is mission for us because it forms the men and women of our country.
