CELEBRATING THE CENTENARY

Our life span lasts seventy years or if we are strong enough eighty years, yet most of them are sorrow and pain, says the Bible in Psalm 90, verse 10. But, Nature takes a special course for noble souls like Sister Mirabelle who turned hundred on 7 April 2019. In His constant and great love, God poured grace upon grace on Sr Mirabelle bringing her to this moment of her Centenary Celebration.

Owing to the Lenten Season in April, the celebrations were anticipated to 9 February 2019. Thirty priests from Jalandhar diocese concelebrated the Holy Eucharist along with Rt Rev Agnelo Gracias, the Apostolic Administrator of Jalandhar Diocese, in the RFC Auditorium of Sacred Heart Convent School, Ludhiana, on 9 February at 10:30 am. Glittering decorations, inspiring quotes loaded with sentiments of gratitude and praise and soothing winter breeze created the best environ possible for such a celebration. The prayers of hundreds of well wishers, sisters and friends of Sr Mirabelle mingled with the prayers of the Bishop and the priests as tears of joy and thankfulness trickled down silently from many an eye.

Affectionate greetings and felicitations loaded her with heaps of flowers as the echoes of Centenary greetings vibrated all around the campus. The fellowship meal provided an occasion for further interactions and greetings.

The celebrations failed to cease as once again on the real date 7 April 2019, prayers and greetings were offered for Sr Mirabelle in the Holy Cross parish church. The Christian community numbering above 400, lovingly and gratefully joined the Parish priest Fr Sunny in the Holy Eucharist, thanking God for the person of Sr Mirabelle, the miracle of her life, for the perfect sight, hearing, movement and overall health God has bestowed on her in this advanced age of 100. The deepest level of worship indeed is praising, thanking and trusting God at all times. Sr Mirabelle reached the church exactly at 9:30 am and with devotion participated in the Holy Eucharist, the felicitations and fellowship meal that lasted three hours. Fr Sunny, in his moving sermon, validated that he was the luckiest Parish Priest privileged to offer the Eucharist on Sr Mirabelle's 100th birthday which is a rare chance. The fellowship meal that followed for almost 500 people was a manifestation of Christian camaraderie.

The magic wand that Sr Mirabelle used is to live joyfully one day at a time trusting in God and



loving others. This special gift from God was thus celebrated with fervor, much fanfare and humility.

The name 'Mirabelle' stems from the Latin word, 'Mirabilis' meaning wondrous. Sr Mirabelle lives up to her name. This wondrous person, young and strong, daring and caring, noble and kind, served with love and commitment for 25 years in the remotest areas of Karnataka State.

Noting her noble qualities of wisdom, understanding, intuitive knowledge, planning and organization abilities, she was chosen in 1965 to be one of the pioneers of Sacred Heart Convent, Ludhiana, Punjab, our third foundation in North India. 54 years of her precious life have been spent here, being a part of Sacred Heart Convent and School. Sr Mirabelle says: "Punjab is my home, Punjabis are my people, I love them."

Her service was bountiful; involvement, substantial; management, impressive in and whatever responsibilities were entrusted to her such as: caring for hostel children like a mother, friend and guide; providing healthy food for sisters, hostel children and school children through school canteen for several years; extending hospitality to outstation sisters, guests and visitors; supervising the study of hostel children and that of school children in the absence of teachers; visiting, interacting and rendering service to the people of villages adopted by the Sacred Heart Convent at Halwara, Ladhian and Nurpur and inspiring and motivating the slow learners to be winners.

Even at the age of 100 Sr Mirabelle refuses to retire. She interacts with dignitaries with ease; answers queries of TV interviewers with confidence; voraciously reads newspapers, periodicals and books and is punctual for all community activities. Sr Mirabelle says, "I have been reading my favourite newspaper, The Tribune, for the last five decades.

Unlike people of her age who are confined to wheel chairs, Sr Mirabelle recognizes people, remembers their names, recalls happy memories and shares experiences especially of our Founder, Servant of God RFC Mascarenhas, and Founding members.

The Punjab Government honoured Sr Mirabelle with the Lifetime Achievement Award on the Teachers' Day in 2016 at the age of 98. Today, Sr Mirabelle's only prayer is "Thank You God for being with me all these years."

Sr Mirabelle was one among the four founding Sisters of Sacred Heart Convent and School, Ludhiana,

established in 1965. The school was in its infancy when I joined the school in July 1973 as a chemistry teacher. I clearly remember the young and energetic Sr Mirabelle assisted by Ms Dotty, managing the school canteen in a make shift room. The selflessness and humility that radiated from her then still adorns her today when she turns 100.

She believes very strongly in the power of prayer. Thirty years back a fete was announced in the school. Everyone was excited for this big show and was looking forward to the day. But just three days before the due date it started pouring and the rain was expected to continue. Everyone was worried. It so happened that I were to meet Sr Mirabelle for some reason. I was told she was in the chapel from morning till evening praying for a good weather. Amazingly, it was a bright sunny weather on the stipulated day and the fete was a grand success!

In the year 2000, my younger brother was admitted to the hospital and was in coma. Sr Mirabelle along with a few sisters visited us in the hospital. She assured me, "We will pray for the speedy recovery of your brother." Incredibly, he was out of coma after a few days.

Last year when Sister Mirabelle had crossed the 99th birthday she got quite sick and had to be admitted to ICU in DMC. When I visited her in the hospital, I saw her usual self- peaceful and composed. She told me, "The whole community is praying for me. I will get alright and definitely go home and celebrate my 100th birthday." And yes! She did celebrate it on 7th April 2019 with the community members in the Holy Cross Church at Sarabha Nagar and on 9 February with the general public of Ludhiana. Her active and energetic participation surprised everyone.

Sr Mirabelle is much pained and feels greatly concerned about the young married couples parting ways and getting divorced, specially those who have been her students. She feels disturbed about the lack of adjustment and understanding among the youngsters these days. While discussing all these once she said, "We sisters come from different family backgrounds, states and varied culture, still we adjust with each other. We even obey our superiors, otherwise how will the community move forward and progress?" How very true are her words!

She has been a silent spiritual guide to everyone by praying for the well being of all those who come in contact with her. I offer my humble wishes to her on the completion of hundred years. May she live long to spread peace and serenity to the people around through her powerful prayers.

BOUNDLESS LOVE

The service that a Bethany Sister renders flows from the compassion within her and it is a 'Service Born out of Love'. This service in the Northern Province is done through various centres located in different states of India organized under the umbrella of Bethany Social Service Society, Punjab. One such Centre Jeevan Jyoti is located in Ludhiana. The Community Centre which imparts non formal education up to Std V. manages an ITI and conducts numerous Vocational Courses, celebrated their Annual Day on 16 March 2019 on the occasion of the International Women's Day. It was a unique and first baby step to bring together 10 NGO's of Ludhiana city in the Ruby Jubilee Auditorium of Sacred Heart Convent School, Ludhiana. Our sisters, dedicated staff and students of Community Centre, friends and well wishers joined hands with this new insight- an onward journey towards empowerment and transformation to experience FULLNESS OF LIFE.

Ashriwad, Har Hath Kalam, Divine Heart, Miracle, Jugnoo, Ekjot, Samarpan, Rehabilitation Centre School for Blind, School for Deaf and Dumb and Red Cross -the 10 NGO's- joined Missionaries of Charity and Bethany Sisters to celebrate this occasion. Fr. Shine Scaria Thomas, advocate and the Parish Priest of Ramdas, and Dr. Shibba Takkar, a renowned cardiologist serving at DMC and an alumni of Sacred Heart Convent School, Ludhiana, were the speakers of the day.

A cultural programme was staged by the migrant children under the banner 'Programme for Promising Children', along with Tailoring and Beauty Culture students of NIOS and Computer Programming Assistance (COPA) of ITI at Community Centre. Various messages on drug abuse, care of the elderly, an appeal by the girl child and the ill effects of social media such as Face book, Twitter, Google, Whatsapp, Instagram and Chrome were enacted to awaken the



audience. Differently abled children of Ashriwad NGO performed Bhangra, while Har Hath Kalam NGOs enacted how begging has become a profession.

Dr. Shibba Takkar captured the attention of audience narrating about Anadhi Joshi, (1865 – 1887) a victim of early marriage, married at the age of 9, the first woman of Indian origin to study and graduate with a degree in medicine in the United States, with the support of her husband, who was a progressive thinker. Dr. Shibba, a compassionate doctor herself, invited everyone to join in the new move begun by Bethany Sisters to make Ludhiana an abode of boundless love.

Fr. Shine remarked that the NGOs have a big role in the society. There are nearly 2 million registered NGOs in India and 86 NGOs in Ludhiana alone apart from the religious men and women serving the people. This means there is one NGO working for every 600 people.
