The Sisters were introduced to the School community in the Assembly and it was a moving experience; their first day at School was on 10th June 2018 which was a Sunday, a working day.

The Celebration commenced with a solemn Holy Eucharist presided over by Bishop and there were 9 concelebrants. Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956 and Basic Structure of the Indian Constitution- a guide to Social Action. Making use of the expertise from within, sisters who had recently attended different courses, shared their knowledge on Alternative system of medicine, Paralegal programme for the village adults and on Preventing human Trafficking.

YOUTH, HOSTEL AND VOCATION ANIMATION MEET:
