Prime Minister of the country asks people – "Where are the detention camps?" And others are

This house named "Shalom" is gifted to Mr and Mrs Sukhampa and Urmila, and their little son Michael. Other Memorial houses are under construction.

A Shelter home for women and children in distress by name "Bethany Solace Home" was inaugurated in Mamit. Mary Mount Convent and School celebrated the Golden Jubilee of its existence in Aizawl. It was a grand and befitting finale to the valuable service rendered without counting the cost. Superior General's presence at these celebrations was really great.

Bethany in the North East Province is active and alive. That is a great sign of vitality. My wish and prayer is that every Bethany Sister rise to the occasion of the present reality, that she become relevant to the changing times and be true witness to the love and peace of Jesus our Lord.

In the mean time there came an offer specifically to Bethany Sisters from the Department of Women and Child Development to take up the project SWADHAR GREH by name. This is a project to cater to the needs of children and women in distress.

Sr Joy BS the Provincial Superior of North East Province with her Council accepted the proposal promptly and generously helped in setting it up by providing necessary financial support to construct facilities for 30 inmates. The Government is expected to finance the residential expenses for food and some personal articles.

On 5th November 2019 SWADHAR GREH took shape as "BETHANY SOLACE HOME" and it was a remarkable day in the annals of Bethany. It was delightful to have Rev Sr M Joy BS, Most Rev Stephen Rotluanga Bishop of Aizawl, Rev Sr Mary Laldikzuali Provincial Councillor, Rev Fr Peter Lalrammuana Parish Priest of St Francis of Assisi Parish, Mr Allan Lalmuanpuia State Coordinator National Aids Control Organization. Sr M Joy BS inaugurated the Bethany Solace Home and Most Rev Bishop blessed it.

Gazing from the presence of various NGOs, It was clear right from the beginning that this undertaking is going to be a ministry of great networking. There were representatives from various Government departments of Mamit District, village/local
